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JOB DESCRIPTION

Education and qualifications:

Required:

- University Degree in Nursery (preferable), Biomedical or allied field.
- Clinical trials coordination training and/or experience.
- Good English skills, especially in writing.

Preferred:

- Good computer skills.
- Evidence of working in the respiratory field is also desirable.

Main responsibilities and duties:

• The post holder will be responsible for coordinating prospective observational studies and clinical trials related to respiratory diseases. Job duties and tasks include: understanding of study protocols, patient's recruitment and scheduling, perform some specific protocol procedures during patient's visits (spirometry, walking test, bio impedance), data collection and electronic data entry, among others. Applicants should be motivated, well organized with the ability to work effectively both autonomously and as part of a team.
