
Education and qualifications:

- Excellent teamwork skills, with good interpersonal, written and oral communication skills.


Desired:

Main responsibilities and duties:

The International Post-Award Research Manager main responsibility is to support Principal Investigators at VHIR to manage effectively their funds obtained from international competitive projects following internal policies and funding bodies' regulations. The main duties of this position will include:

- Manage grant budgets (economically and administratively), prepare financial reports and audits.
- Monitor budget and anticipate possible deviations during project implementation, plan risk contingency actions and make appropriate amendments to grant agreements.
- Monitor projects' work plan, scientific reports and implementation of grant agreements.



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
- Ensure compliance with institutional and sponsoring agencies' regulations and policies.
- Serve as liaison between researchers, funding agencies and coordinators of collaborative projects. Provide support in consortium meetings organization and other related project activities.
- Any other duties related to the job as requested to contribute to the general functioning of the International Project Office.
