- Specialist training in Paediatrics (via MIR or equivalent)

- Track record of publications in the field of Neuro-Oncology

- Experience in Research in Paediatric Haematology, Oncology & Stem Cell Transplantation
- Good communication skills and good team player

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Main responsibilities and duties:
